## New roles, more production

Title contenders anted up like never before this past NBA offseason, yet those moves didn't have the most fantasy relevance.

Instead, lower-profile teams made a series of changes that created new opportunities for several players to shine. Here are five players who are worth picking up because they will benefit from increased responsibility:

**Anthony Morrow**  
SG/SF,  
Golden State

Morrow showcased a deft shooting touch in his rookie year by averaging 10.1 points with fantastic shooting percentages in just 23 minutes per game.

Even with rookie 3-point specialist Stephen Curry replacing shot-happy Jamal



Crawford (now in Atlanta), coach Don Nelson will carve out enough minutes for Morrow to make him a valuable fantasy role player.

Morrow is the most efficient scorer among himself, Curry and point guard Monta Ellis. He averaged 22 points over eight preseason games.

**Ramon Sessions**  
PG/SG, Minnesota

He changed wintry locales — from Milwaukee to Minneapolis — during free agency, but his play should remain just as sizzling as it was after the All-Star break last year (13.6 points, 7.5 assists, 4.2 rebounds per game).

Don't mind rookie point guard Jonny Flynn. Sessions can man the two-guard spot, and the Wolves just happen to have a hole there. Lean on Sessions for help in points and assists while expecting respectable shooting percentages.

**Brandon Rush**  
SG/SF, Indiana

Mike Dunleavy (right knee) is out until at least January. Marquis Daniels (Boston) and Jarrett Jack (Toronto) moved on during free agency. That leaves Rush to battle with offensively inept Dahntay Jones at shooting guard on a Pacers team that, appropriately, ranked third last year in

pace (number of team possessions per game).

As a preseason starter, Rush averaged more than a steal and a block in addition to his 12.4 scoring average and 86.7 free-throw percentage.

Don't sleep on him.

**Channing Frye**  
PF/C, Phoenix

He fell into anonymity amid the other talent in Portland the past two seasons, so Frye opened a new chapter in his career by signing with the Suns.

The 26-year-old has been inserted as the starting center for a squad hell-bent on returning to its famed "seven seconds or less" offensive philosophy. That means more possessions per game on both ends, which would make the one-time Knick's 2005-06 rookie year averages of 12.3 points and 5.7 rebounds easily attainable.

**Trevor Ariza**  
SG/SF, Houston

Ariza spurned Cleveland to sign with a Rockets squad devoid of its usual impact players. With Yao Ming (left foot) out for the year and Tracy McGrady (left knee) on the mend until at least mid-December, Ariza finds himself as a primary scoring option for the first time.

He displayed his all-around skills in a scaled-down role with the Lakers; now he can use his uptick in minutes and increased freedom on the court to become one of your team's five most important players.

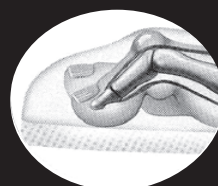
